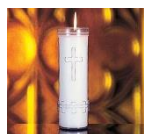

First Reading: Wisdom 3:1-9

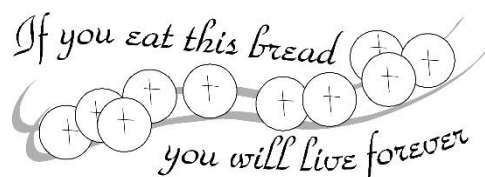
Those who left this earth before us are at peace, in the hands of God. The Lord is their King forever, and His grace, mercy and love are with His elect.
